Describe the experiences of people struggling to access affordable and suitable housing in the context of your organisation's work.

NCADA is arguing for structual change in the way Aboriginal social/affordable housing assets are owned and managed in NSW. We are calling for a pilot program in northern NSW where a regional property trust (statutory) is established to hold transferred title of housing stock in the region owned by the NSW AHO. This will enable more dwellings to be funded moving forward in partnership with Aboriginal landowner groups across the region. This alleviates stress on the sector and improves the livelihoods of those who have been displaced and are seeking assistance.
